Thanks for your kind letter of Dec. 2nd which I received this evening. I sent my card in August '39, but as it did not reach you, here is a new one. Your suggestion about the date is correct, see other side!

I am very thankfull for the hamspirit you showed by making it possible for me to get the 1941 copies of our magazine. Did not yet receive the Dec. number, but it takes a long way thru Siberia!

Amateur-radio is practically at a complete standstil now in Europe. As far as we in Holland are concerned, reception of foreign transmitters, except Germans, is forbidden so I cannot give you any official comment on long-range reception. About local conditions- there is much background noise now and then in our set and I expect a lot of statics as soon as the winterweather is over. So poor business.

Talking about business. If your company could ship its products, we might make a big contract now! However, there will not be anything like that before the war is over and then it shall not be needed.
